Cultural competency to work with people of diverse backgrounds. Ability to work independently and in an environment with minimal supervision. Provide individual and small- group instruction to adapt the curriculum to the needs of students with varying intellectual and artistic abilities, and to accommodate a variety of instructional activities. Excellent verbal and written communication skills.
	Develop lesson plans and deliver instruction to youth and/or adult students. Submit requests for supplies to studio technicians in a timely manner. Track student attendance for assigned classes. Commitment to nurturing students at their level of experience and supporting their creative growth. Prepare materials for each assigned class. Instruct students in the proper use and care of tools, materials, and studios. Return the studio to the same, or better, level of cleanliness after each assigned class. Provide feedback to the supervisor for areas of improvement or ideas for new class offerings.
