CONSIDERATION OF APPROVAL OF THE ENACTMENT OF ORDINANCE C-10-2017 AMENDING CHAPTER 34, "ZONING", TO INCLUDE NEW SECTION 4.59 "ONE-FAMILY DWELLING STANDARDS"; ZONING TEXT AMENDMENT 3, 2017; AND APPROVAL OF SUMMARY FOR PUBLICATION.

Planning and Community Development Director, Ed Gardiner, explained that the two ordinances before Council this evening were Introduced by City Council at their last meeting. This ordinance would create a new section in the Zoning Ordinance for One-Family Dwelling Standards and essentially move those standards from the City Code to the Zoning Ordinance and allow for the elimination of the One Family Construction Review Board for purposes of appeals that would now go before the Zoning Board of Appeals.

Director Gardiner explained that this ordinance relates to the ordinance previously enacted and would eliminate the One-Family Construction Review standards from the City Code that are now in the Zoning Ordinance.

CONSIDERATION OF APPROVAL OF THE INTRODUCTION OF AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 7, "BUILDINGS AND BUILDING REGULATIONS," ARTICLE III OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF FARMINGTON HILLS BY ADOPTING THE 2015 INTERNATIONAL PROPERTY MAINTENANCE CODE. CMR 12-17-105

Director Gardiner explained that currently Chapter 7 of the City Code references by adoption the 2009 International Property Maintenance Code. His staff together with the Fire Marshal and City Attorney's Office reviewed the option of adopting by reference the 2015 International Property Maintenance Code that would include a section on handling fire damaged structures. The ordinance is proposed for introduction this evening.

CONSIDERATION OF APPROVAL OF THE INTRODUCTION OF AN ORDINANCE TO AUTHORIZE THE CONVEYANCE OF OUTLOT B OF NORMANDY HILLS SUBDIVISION NO. 1 TO WILLIAM AND DIANE HOLCOMB. CMR 12-17-106

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Assistant City Manager Mekjian stated that the property in question is Outlot B of Normandy Hills Subdivision that was transferred to the city in 1986. The Upper Rouge River cuts through this property to the extent that a portion is in the floodway and the river is flowing across the property during large storms. He explained that the adjacent property owners have expressed a desire to have the property transferred to them in order to maintain that property to their standards; and the City feels conveying the property would be mutually beneficial as the city would save resources it has been expending to maintain the property thus far. He noted that the sanitary sewer interceptor will be preserved in an existing easement. The City Attorney's Office reviewed the purchase agreement and proposed quit claim deed and the proposed cost is \$250. Mr. Mekjian added that the City paid \$60 for four parcels back in 1986 and this was one of the four.

Councilmember Knol inquired how the state acquired the property before the city purchased the property.

Mr. Mekjian stated that the best guess when there is such an outlot in a development was that the developer at the time felt there may be a community well or other piece of infrastructure that would sit on that property to serve the entire development. He added the city currently is the only party that has rights to this parcel.
