#### **PUBLIC QUESTIONS AND COMMENTS**

Tom DeWard of Independence Commons had the following questions or comments:

- Inquired about the time frame for the City Manager's certification of the total cost of the improvement for Independence Commons per Section 25-20 of the City Code.
- He requested that the city complete any past certifications not complete and allow resident review.
- Requested reimbursement for costs spent on Freedom of Information Act requests.
- Reported that the curbs on the cul-de-sacs in Independence Commons should be 4 inches and they are only 2 inches and he felt residents should receive a refund for the work not completed.

- Requested the city develop a proposal to complete the road projects planned for this season that were not done and for the coming season for safety reasons.
- Feels there were city errors on various Personal Property Taxes and he feels it is incumbent upon the city to notify the residents of the errors, correct those and help residents file the proper paperwork to recover the refunds.

#### **CITY MANAGER UPDATE**

Assistant City Manager Mekjian made the following announcements:

- An Open House for Greencastle residents is being held Thursday, October 26<sup>th</sup> from 4-7pm in the Community Room at City Hall
- Public Services is hosting the following events: Annual Paint a Plow with National Honor Society Students from North Farmington HS and the STEAM Academy Robotics Club to study water.
- The Great Lakes Water Authority has reported a water main break at 14 Mile and Verona
- Last week of yard waste pick up will be November 27<sup>th</sup> December 1<sup>st</sup> on the regularly scheduled collection day

#### **PUBLIC HEARING:**

Mayor Massey explained that the first four (4) ordinance amendments were related so they would be discussed together and the public hearing would be opened for members of the public to comment on those amendments, but separate motions would be required for each ordinance.

Ed Gardiner, Director of Planning and Community Development, explained that Zoning Text Amendment 1, 2017 and the ordinances that fall under City Code Amendment 1, 2017 all relate to wireless communication. He stated that the current ordinance was adopted almost 20 years ago and many changes in technology have occurred since that time and State regulations have changed so it was felt it was a good time to review and possibly amend the city's ordinance for wireless communication. Director Gardiner explained that the Planning Commission has provided a text amendment for Council's consideration after holding their public hearing on September 21, 2017. He noted that Planning Consultant Arroyo was present to provide a brief presentation on the proposed amendments and then the public hearing is required this evening prior to any action of Council.

Planning Consultant Arroyo reviewed the proposed amendments and highlighted the major changes that included:

- Updating definitions based that aligned with Federal/State changes and including a purpose
- Making it easier to co-locate on existing buildings
- Providing for a tiered review system to ensure the proposal is in line with Federal/State regulations
- Specific site plan review requirements
- Establishing a licensing procedure to allow for Distributed Antenna System (DAS) on existing poles

Mayor Massey mentioned that this issue was previously discussed with City Council at a study session meeting.

Councilmember Rich clarified that the city is proposing the amendments to be responsive and allow for more access to technology for residents.

Mayor Massey opened the public hearing for the 4 amendments discussed. There were no public comments; therefore, Mayor Massey closed the public hearing.

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Director Gardiner explained that about a year ago the Council approved almost a complete re-write of the city's sign ordinance and once those provisions were implemented and enforced, some questions arose that staff felt could be addressed with some minor revisions. The proposed revisions were presented to Council at a study session meeting and then reviewed by the Planning Commission. The Planning Commission held their public hearing on the proposed changes September 21, 2017 and before Council this evening are the proposed changes for consideration.

Planning Consultant Arroyo briefly reviewed the proposed amendments, many of which were clarifications to meet the intent of the ordinance.

Mayor Massey opened the public hearing. There being no public comments, Mayor Massey closed the public hearing.
