





Feelings about Deer




Other Feelings

Top Themes

- Danger: Many residents feel the deer population is a danger to their landscaping and family members due to increased risk of deer tick related diseases. They are also concerned about the amount of auto accidents that are directly related to the deer population.
- 2. Concern: Residents are concerned about the destruction to property, specifically gardens and landscaping. They are also worried that the deer population has become too large, is taking over the area, and is causing an increase in deer related auto accidents.
- **3. Overpopulation**: Many of the residents feel that the population could be reduced to a lower number.

Other Concerns


Top Themes

- 1. Poop: Residents are concerned about the amount of deer feces in their yards. They would like to see cities mitigate the deer population so they can enjoy their back yards.
- 2. Disease: Residents are worried about friends, pets and family members getting a disease from the deer ticks and feces in their yards. They are also concerned about Chronic Wasting Disease.
- 3. Habitats: Some residents are concerned about habitat loss for the deer and construction that will farther reduce safe wildlife areas.

 Many are concerned about the increase of predators.



Experienced/Observed any of the Following




Other Experiences/Observations

Top Themes

- Feces: Residents are tired of the excessive amount of deer feces in their yards.
- 2. Dead: Many residents are concerned about the high number of vehicle accidents involving deer and the cities' slow response at removal of deer carcasses. Residents are also concerned for the lack of habitat for the wildlife population which is causing the deer to inhabit neighborhoods and increase deer auto accidents.
- Damage: Many residents are very concerned about the damage to their landscaping from the deer population as well as vehicle damage.

Other Wildlife Concerns

Top Themes:

- 1. Skunks: Residents are concerned about the skunk population. They are spraying pets.
- 2. Coyote: Residents are concerned about the potential increase in coyote activity in this area due to the large deer population.
- 3. Wildlife: Some residents enjoy seeing the different types of wildlife, while others would rather have all wildlife in the area removed.
