PRESENTATION OF HISTORIC DISTRICT COMMISSION 2020 ANNUAL REPORT

Angeline Lawrence, Staff Planner and Ken Klemmer, Historic District Commission (HDC) Chair presented the 2020 Annual Report to City Council.

Councilmember Knol, HDC Council Liaison, commented on the work that the Commission has been doing particularly on the headstone renovations and on the Spicer House. She stated that the City of Farmington Hills has an obligation to maintain the integrity of the historic district sites and there are updates needed to the Spicer House and to the cemetery headstones that should be included in future capital improvement budgets by the appropriate department.

In response to Council, Chair Klemmer noted that there were approximately 76 historic properties in the city and that the North Farmington Cemetery on Farmington Road is privately owned and not part of the city's historic district.

COUNCIL MEMBERS COMMENTS AND ANNOUNCEMENTS

The following comments and announcements were made:

• Council member Bridges commented that the City Council goals session minutes of January 16, 2021 did not reflect his comments made at the time on hiring a Diversity and Inclusion Equity Director. He had provided information to Council from the MML, ICMA and Michigan Civil Rights Division for that meeting. He wanted to outline what he proposed at that time and requested the following statement to be included in the current meeting minutes verbatim:

"This person will direct evaluation, development and implementation of policies and procedures and programs through the lens of diversity, equity and inclusion. He or she will report to the City Manager and work directly with all city departments within the city and with community stakeholders to ensure that these shared values of diversity, equity and inclusion are evident in the city's service delivery and collaboration"

- Councilmember Knol mentioned Mr. Callahan's correspondence and offered to provide some history on this issue during the budget discussions for other members that were not on Council at the time. She noted this relates to a resolution that she had requested regarding the road millages and how they were structured

CITY MANAGER UPDATE

City Manager Mekjian provided the following update:

- He mentioned several construction projects in the city and encouraged residents to sign up for the construction list serve to get information on upcoming projects.
- Oakland County will be testing outdoor warning sirens the first Saturday of each month beginning March 6, 2021

Mayor Pro-Tem Boleware requested an update on the Diversity and Inclusion Officer and website updates that were brought up at the City Council goals session. She was hoping the website search engine capabilities would be improved.

Acting City Manager Mekjian stated that he is currently working with the Human Resource Director to gather information on a Diversity and Inclusion Officer position. He plans to budget for the position in the event Council makes the decision to hire a staff person. He discussed website improvements already in place and that they could look at ways to improve search capabilities.

Councilmember Strickfaden suggested challenging area students to develop an improved home page for the website.

NEW BUSINESS

CONSIDERATION OF ADOPTION OF A RESOLUTION TO APPOINT A TEMPORARY ACTING CITY MANAGER.

City Attorney explained that Mr. Mekjian had a pre-planned, one-week vacation and since he is currently serving as the Acting City Manager until his contract is finalized as City Manager, it was suggested that in his absence an Acting City Manager is appointed. The proposed resolution would appoint City Clerk Smith and she has agreed to fill that role while Mr. Mekjian is on vacation.

Councilmember Bridges inquired if a salary increase for Clerk Smith is required by Council for that week. Clerk Smith responded that she did not request an increase in salary for that week.
