Learn CPR during American Heart Month: Farmington Hills Fire Department to Hold Community Training on Feb. 27

Participants will also learn lifesaving AED and Stop the Bleed tourniquet skills

FARMINGTON HILLS, Mich. (Jan. 29, 2024) — The Farmington Hills Fire Department and the City of Farmington Hills Emergency Preparedness Commission are teaming up to offer an American Heart Association Heartsaver® class to train members of the public in CPR, AED and Stop the Bleed tourniquet training on **Thursday, Feb. 27**, during American Heart Month. The course is designed for anyone, including people with little to no medical training.

"We know every second counts when it comes to cardiac arrest and traumatic injuries," said Farmington Hills Fire Chief Jon Unruh. "Thanks to community members who participate in this lifesaving course, and our highly skilled EMTs and paramedics, Farmington Hills has one of the highest cardiac arrest survival rates in the United States."

According to the American Heart Association, more than 350-thousand cardiac arrests occur outside of the hospital each year. Bystander intervention can double, or even triple, a person's chance of survival if CPR is administered immediately after cardiac arrest. Through this vital training, participants will learn how to recognize cardiac arrest and the actions to take while awaiting first responder arrival.

The class, open to individuals ages 12 and up, will be held **from 5:30-10 p.m. on Thursday, Feb. 27 at Fire Station #4 located at 28711 Drake Road**. Children under 18-years-old must register with a parent or guardian. Registration is \$10 for residents of Farmington Hills and Farmington and \$20 for non-residents. To receive an American Heart Association Certificate of Training, an additional \$20 fee is required regardless of residential status. The electronic certification card can be printed or accessed online and is valid for two years. The class requires that participants are physically able to kneel on the floor and use their arms and hands to perform continuous chest compressions.

To ensure the proper student-instructor ratio, registration fees are due by Thursday, Feb. 20 and are non-refundable. Payments may be made with cash or check at the City of Farmington Hills Fire Department Headquarters/Station #5 at 31455 W. Eleven Mile Road. Cash payments must be made with exact change, and checks should be made payable to City of Farmington Hills. To register, contact FDevents@FHgov.com.
