Farmington Hills Clerk’s Office to Temporarily Relocate Precincts 10 and 11 for Aug. 6 Primary Election

Precincts 10 and 11 will return to their regular location for future elections

FARMINGTON HILLS, Mich. (June 7, 2024) – Due to building renovations taking place at Kenbrook Elementary School and Farmington Central High School, the City must relocate two precinct locations for the upcoming Aug. 6, 2024 State Primary Election. **These changes will affect all in-person Election Day voters in Precinct 10 and Precinct 11 for the August Primary Election only.**

Precinct #11 (map)	Farmington Central High School: 30175 Highmeadow Road	Woodcreek Elementary School: 28400 Harwich Drive

Voters located in these precincts will receive a notice by mail with information regarding the temporary polling locations. Once again, these temporary locations are for the **August 2024 Primary only**, and both precincts will return to their regular locations for the Nov. 5, 2024 State General Election.
