EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS COMMISSION TIP OF THE MONTH

The following Tip of the Month was read by Robert York, Emergency Preparedness Commission Member:

EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS COMMISSION Tip of the Month July 2017

One of the great things about living here in the mid-west is that during the summer we walk the roads and sidewalks of our various neighborhoods and have an opportunity to reconnect with those who live in our community. The Emergency Preparedness Commission encourages everyone to take advantage of this naturally friendly season to get to know your neighbors better, and to do the things that will make you a better neighbor: learn new first aid skills, join or form a Neighborhood Watch group, find out who in your neighborhood has special needs. Building relationships and learning important skills can be extremely important in dealing with, or recovering from, an emergency situation. If, while you're out walking, you have a pet walking next to you, remember that you need to include any household pets in your emergency preparedness plans.

There are approximately 34,000 households in Farmington Hills. Unfortunately, every street and apartment building houses people who do not know their neighbors. Yet in time of crisis, it is your neighbor who might be the most important for your survival.

We encourage everyone to get acquainted with your neighbors. During a disaster or crisis, members of a neighborhood might need to pool their available assets, such as tools, equipment, and skills, in order to help each other.

Two other summertime tips:

- 1) Take heat seriously. It seems like summer comes late and doesn't last long enough in Michigan, but on the hot days that are coming, don't underestimate the seriousness of heat illness. So as you're having fun, remember to drink plenty of water, avoid sunburn and heat stress, and review your first aid skills regarding heat illnesses.
- 2) And since we mentioned tornados, most tornados in Michigan occur in April, May, June and July between 3 and 7 p.m. Have a tornado escape plan in place, and practice with your family.

NEW BUSINESS

CONSIDERATION OF APPROVAL OF AN AMENDMENT TO CONSENT JUDGMENT FOR THE MDT BUILDING LOCATED AT 30230 ORCHARD LAKE ROAD. CMR 7-17-68

Director of Planning and Community Development Ed Gardiner stated that staff met with MDT regarding a request to construct an outdoor patio on their building. He explained that since the property was part of a consent judgment that prohibited outdoor activity, the request would require an amendment to the consent judgment to allow for the construction. This matter was first brought before Council at their last study session meeting and the consent judgment as prepared by the City Attorney is before Council this evening for consideration.

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Mark Cohn, Attorney for MDT, explained that they are seeking approval of the consent judgment to allow an outdoor patio off the east wall. He noted that the patio is meant to be accessed from within the building and would be for use by employees only. He stated that two-thirds of their 145 employees work out of this building and the patio is proposed to enhance the employee experience and to help attract and retain employees. Mr. Cohn stated that they are in a competitive industry and they are creating a lifestyle with this building for their employees. He mentioned that there is a neighborhood behind the building so hours will be limited and there will be no speakers or music. Mr. Cohn stated that it is a soft use but important and a good enhancement to the building.

Attorney Joppich stated that a few clarifications were made to the consent judgment after it was included in City Council's packet and that revised consent judgment has been provided to Council this evening. The changes agreed upon by both parties were made to page 3 to clarify that Exhibit D was the deed to be attached and page 5 to clarify that the patio area shall not be used as a <u>designated</u> outdoor smoking area and to permit the use of portable propane gas heating units for a grill and gas fire pit.

Councilmember Rich inquired if the residents were notified of this meeting. Mr. Gardiner stated that they were not notified as this matter did not require a public hearing.

MOTION by Lerner, support by Bridges, that the City Council of Farmington Hills hereby approves the amended Consent Judgment as presented by MDT and conceptual plans dated June, 2017; and directs the City Manager, City Clerk and City Attorney to execute and record the proposed Amendment to the Consent Judgment.

MOTION CARRIED 6-1 (Rich opposed).

Councilmember Steckloff stated that she appreciates the company asking for this for their employees and feels that more companies should be doing something similar.

<u>CONSIDERATION OF APPROVAL OF AN APPOINTMENT TO THE BROWNFIELD</u> REDEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY.
