PUBLIC QUESTIONS AND COMMENTS

Melanie Williams, Greencastle Subdivision, stated that she was pleased to hear that positive progress was being made on the residents' behalf with regard to the water issues they experienced, but mentioned that on January 26, 2017, they had an oily sheen to their water. WRC dug up the well but the source of the oil is still unknown and she still has an open hole in her front yard with no answers. She questioned why a

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water sample would not have been taken that day and was taken 2 weeks later, which she feels is another example of WRC handling the situation poorly. She added that she looks forward to a resolution.

<u>NEW BUSINESS</u> <u>CONSIDERATION OF APPROVAL OF THE FIRST AMENDMENT TO PLANNED UNIT</u> DEVELOPMENT (PUD) 1, 2011 AGREEMENT.

Edward Gardiner, Director of Planning and Community Development, explained that approximately 6 years ago, City Council approved a PUD plan for the property in question for the owner to build an EZ Storage Facility. The owner has since purchased the property to the south that has sat vacant for years and submitted plans to amend the PUD in order to build another second storage facility. The plan has also been approved by Council and as part of the approval an amended PUD agreement was required. Mr. Gardiner noted that the amended PUD agreement before Council this evening has been reviewed by the City Attorney.

Commander Dan Rodriguez, explained that the Police Department has participated in the Oakland County Narcotics Enforcement Team Program for multiple years and this agreement as well as the next one to be discussed will allow for the reimbursement of overtime funds for agents involved in the NET program. He stated that this first agreement will allow for reimbursement for all overtime expenses associated with HIDTA up to the amount of \$4,333 per year. The agreement presented has been reviewed by the City Attorney.

Assistant City Manager Mekjian reported that a couple of weeks ago the city was contacted by a resident about a sewer system back-up. Oakland County was able to confirm that there were no issues with the public sewer system but that the issue was caused by a in the sewer lead to the home that is the responsibility of the homeowner. The resident indicated that he has had some financial issues and could not afford the repairs, but also did not qualify for financial assistance through the city. Mr. Mekjian explained that the sewer is very deep and is under the road and would require a specific contractor to handle the work so due to these special circumstances, the city determined to create a single-lot assessment per ordinance that would allow the resident to pay for the repair over time on the tax roll. The City Attorney's Office prepared the proposed agreement that would allow for this that is before Council this evening for consideration.
