Another goal: analyzing what senior housing we have and identifying unmet needs for housing for seniors. By the year 2030, our senior population will grow to ~30,000 (from ~21,000 in 2015). Hammer to meet with Economic Development Directors from both cities, to share changing demographics and promote how this is a place developers would want to build senior housing. Hammer and Committee to talk with City Planning Commission and Economic Development Leads. Hobson to research part-time work opportunities for seniors. Senior Division is going to do a housing fair in May to share with seniors what housing options are available. Consider conducting a survey at this event. How can we capitalize on retired citizens to support community STEM / energy and efforts mentor other citizens. Investigate how this can work with 'Sage' program
