Hiring officers, dispatchers and actively recruiting. Moving forward with Next Generation 911 technology to replace analog emergency phone call taking equipment with a digital system that is faster and more efficient. It will allow callers the ability to contact an emergency center by text messaging. Should be in place after July 1, 2016. Right now, in case the emergency call center closes, calls relocated to WBPD and/or Fire Station #5. Narcan counteracts the effects of overdose from either prescription drugs or heroin. There was discussion and disagreement from Wecker and Warthman on who would be carrying it. All emergency vehicles for sure and requiring emergency personnel to be trained to administer it. Wecker to follow up with forwarding law to all.
