How to be prepared for the November election:

Make sure you're registered to vote.

Eligible persons may register to vote through 8pm on Election Day but are encouraged to do so as soon as possible. Make sure everyone in your family who is 18 or older is registered. Keep in mind that students can register at 17 ½ and are eligible to vote if they turn 18 on or before Election Day!





Decide if you want to vote by absentee ballot or vote in-person on Election Day.

Absent voter ballots are available 40 days prior to each election at the City Clerk's Office. While a reason is no longer needed to vote by absentee ballot, this information may

be especially important if you are planning to be out of town on Election Day. With the passage of Proposal 2 this past November, voters may also be placed on a permanent list to automatically receive a ballot for every election going forward. Contact the City Clerk's Office for more information.

Be an Informed Voter.

<u>Voting in person on Election Day.</u>

If you are voting in person at your polling location on Election Day, know where you vote ahead of time. Polling locations are open on Election Day from 7am until 8pm and polling location interactive maps can be found on the city's website.
