Samantha suggested a program on Social Media Educattion.  Chuck Nebus: 1). The Central American children did not come and may not ever come because of lower than expected numbers. He expressed regret and concern for the newly hired professionals and staff that gave up other positions to work in the new program that will not exist.  2). Heroin is an increasing problem. There has been 63 overdoses and one death and that is a 48% increase in the City. There has been a 300% increase in the County. Between 2010-2012 deaths have doubled Nationally. Heroin was 3% pure years ago and now it is 90% pure and relatively cheap. 4). Of concern is the fact that Prescription Drugs can be the gateway to other drugs. Tony Lewis: He discussed the heightened sensitivity in the State between citizens and law enforcement. No community is immune. He requested that the Farmington/Farmington Hills Police Chiefs to be sure there is education and communication with Police Officers.
